As the summer progresses, the golf course naturally becomes more crowded and the need to be even more aware of proper Pace of Play becomes essential. The WSWG is expected to keep up an appropriate pace of play. Our morning tee times set the pace for the day and if our pace is slow it will cause a domino effect! Consistent slow play by our group may even impact our club's status with the pro shop and hamper our right to preferred tee times.

Please endeavor to complete your eighteen-hole round within four hours and thirty minutes or less. It is even possible to play in closer to 4 hours if everyone is paying attention and is not being held up by the group ahead.

I found the following statement helpful: "Pace of Play is crucial to the enjoyment levels for everyone playing today. It is imperative that you Maintain your Position with the group playing directly in front of you at all times. Don't worry about the group behind you."

In reviewing this issue with Collin, he suggests simply "If you are not waiting on the group in front of you, you are behind"!
